B. Theories of Adolescence

- How did G. Stanley Hall characterize adolescence? evolutionary transition from beast to human / time of "storm and stress"
- What influenced Margaret Mead to disagree with Hall's view? studies of adolescence showed a time of enjoyment / culture played a role she said

C. Physical Development

- What biological event marks the end of childhood? puberty
- How do adolescents develop physically during this period? growth spurt = both
girls = breasts, hips fill out, pubic hair, menarche boys = pubic hair, larger genitalia, broader build, deeper voice, facial hair
- How do individual growth differences affect an adolescent's personality?
Early-maturing boys = more self-confident and independent
Early-maturing girls = feel embarrassed, bossy, date older boys
Late-maturing girls = get along better with peers

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D. Sexual Development

- What behavioral changes accompany sexual maturation? attitudes about sex and gender roles and cultural expectations
- What do studies indicate about the children of teenage mothers? tend to be teenage parents, do poorly in school, serve time in prison
- What fears affect sexual behavior? pregnancy, STD's, AIDS
